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The idea of an exhibition of self portraits the first of its kind in the country conjured immense and exciting possibilities for me and for several artists, critics, art lovers to whom I had expressed this idea.

Spurring the self indulgent or self contemplative artists to unmask themselves for yet another time and on the other hand inducing the reluctant artists to confront themselves in their medium, the idea was very invigorating. From the tension or the exhilaration of this confrontation was energized a wide sweep of work crystallizing into this exhibition of self portraits of artists.

Although the work of most artists is in a way autobiographical whereby their own images and interpretations are reflected in their work, to paint a self-portrait is different from this autobiographical element. It is a direct confrontation with oneself. It is not necessarily a narcissistic exercise.

Many artists have involved themselves to view the images around them. They have not looked at themselves introspectively so far. For them it was a challenge as it was for me to persuade them to indulge in this exercise of painting a self portrait.

Several artists conveyed that this was the first time they were attempting a self portrait. It had triggered off a restlessness whereby one self portrait is now not enough and were beset by the urge to create more. This self-confrontation and self-contemplation could be a fresh break in their work.

For sculptors a self portrait is a challenge for sculpture is multi-dimensional and viewed from all angles and Jagadish, Ladi,

Radhakrishnan and Soman have met this challenge adventurously. Some artists have viewed themselves primarily as artists. Their life and art inextricably intertwined as portrayed in the self portraits of Arpana Caur, M F Husain and DLN Reddy.

Some like Shyamal Datta Ray have reflected about themselves as after having departed from the world.

While others are violent confrontations with themselves as in the self portraits of Altaf and Sunil Das.

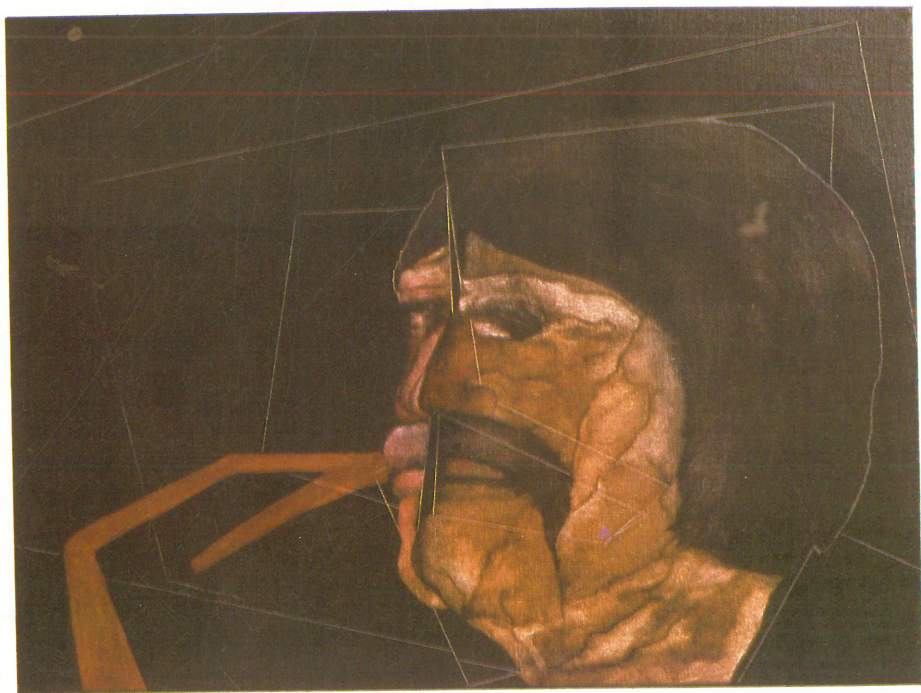
Some are modest, sensitive and introspective ponderings as those of R B Bhaskaran, Shamshad Husain, Ved Nayar, Manu Parekh, Mickey Patel, Ganesh Pyne, Gogi Saroj Pal, Paritosh Sen, Bulbul Sharma, K G Subramanyan.

Some see themselves as spectators in the drama of life as reflected in the works of Shail Choyal, Nalini Malani, Navjot, and Gulam mohammed Sheikh.

Embedded within the intrigues of a self portrait are the sensibilities of the artists. Hence concealed in a gesture of the eyebrow or in the angle of the nose may be suggestions of the fullness of the heart or assertions of ecstasy affecting the artist at the moment the self portrait was executed.

“Paintings must be presented as geographical maps of human nature and its energies,” according to Roberto Matta. If a series of self portraits of an artist could be gathered together chronologically, written here may be the commentary of his or her life. This could be an interesting study by itself.

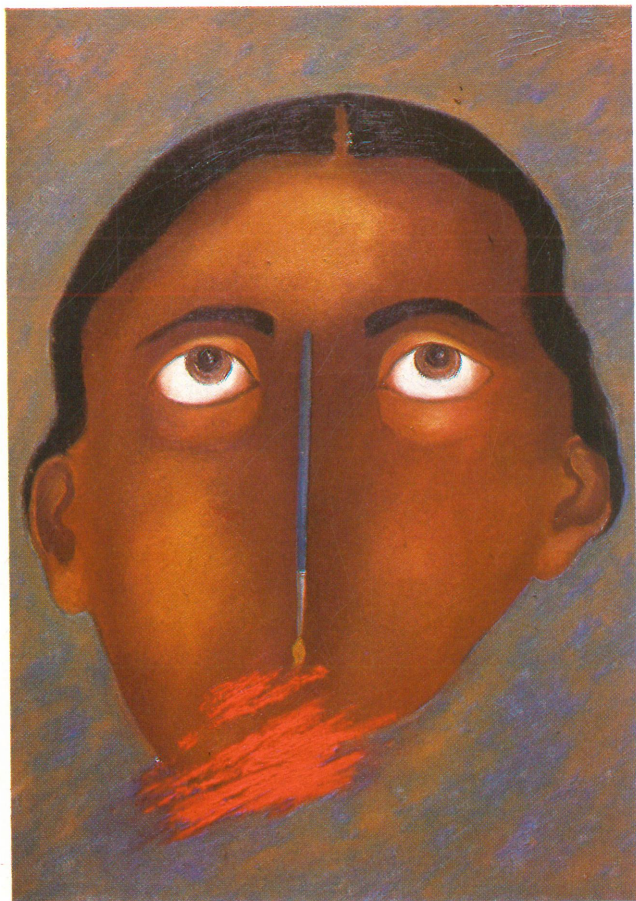

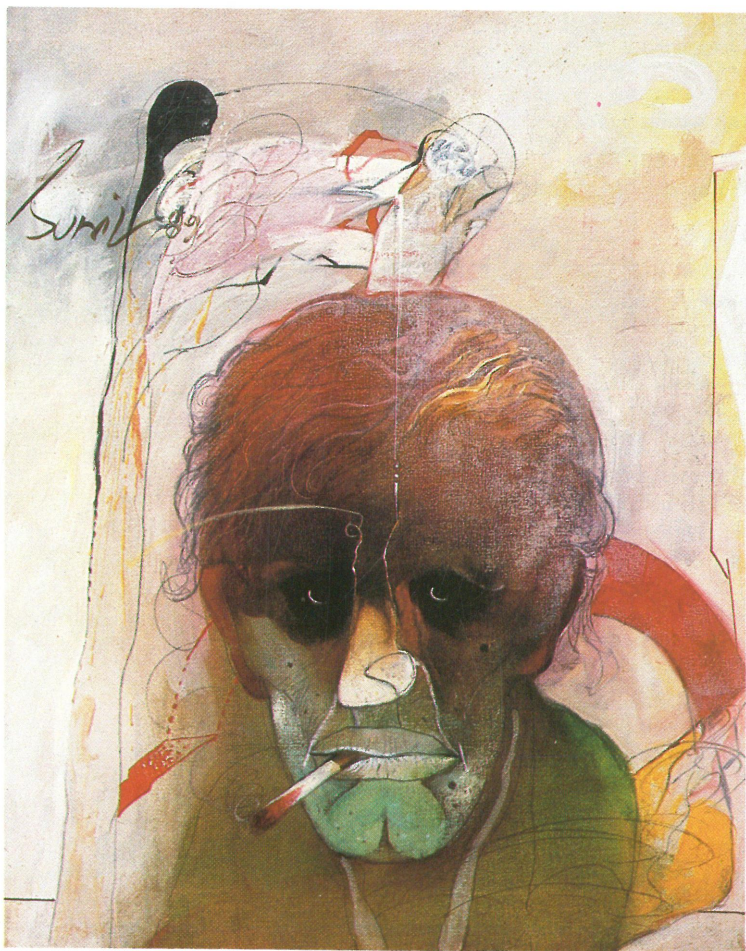

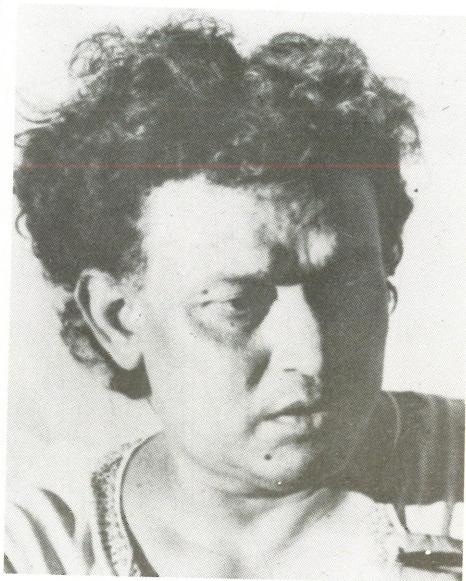

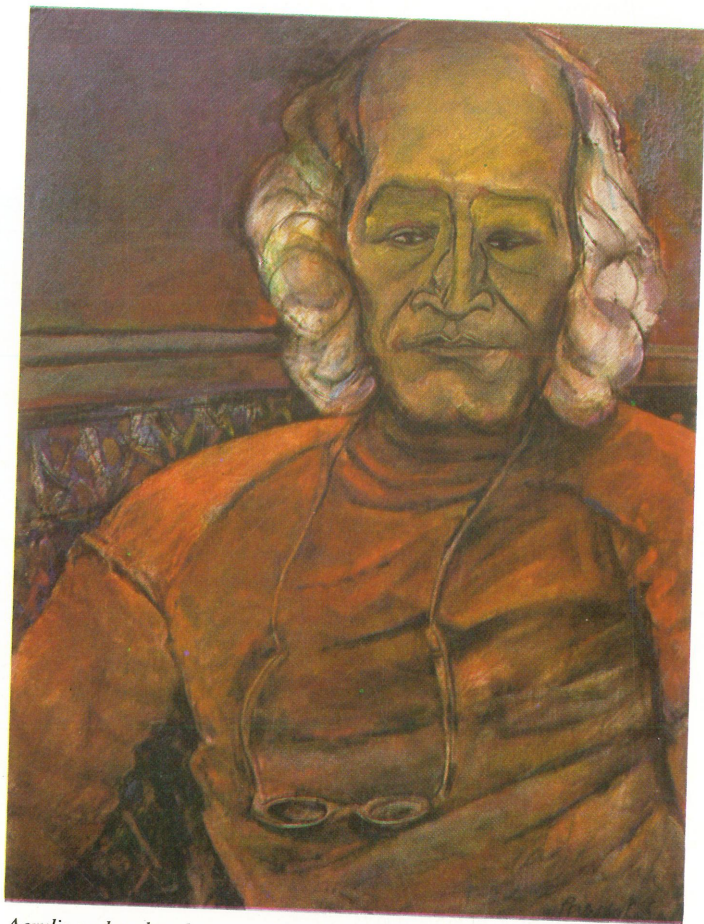

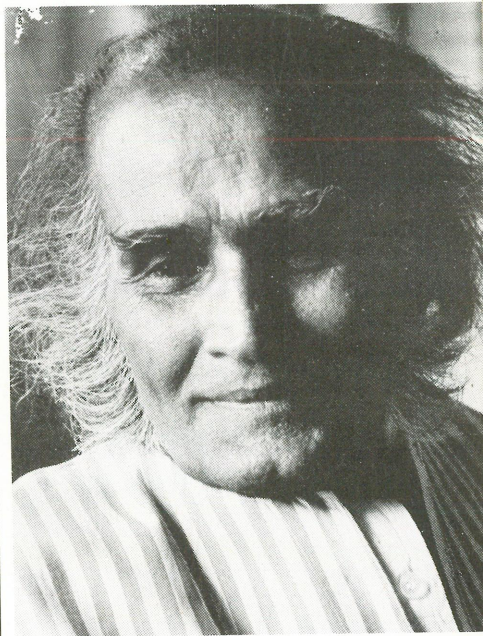

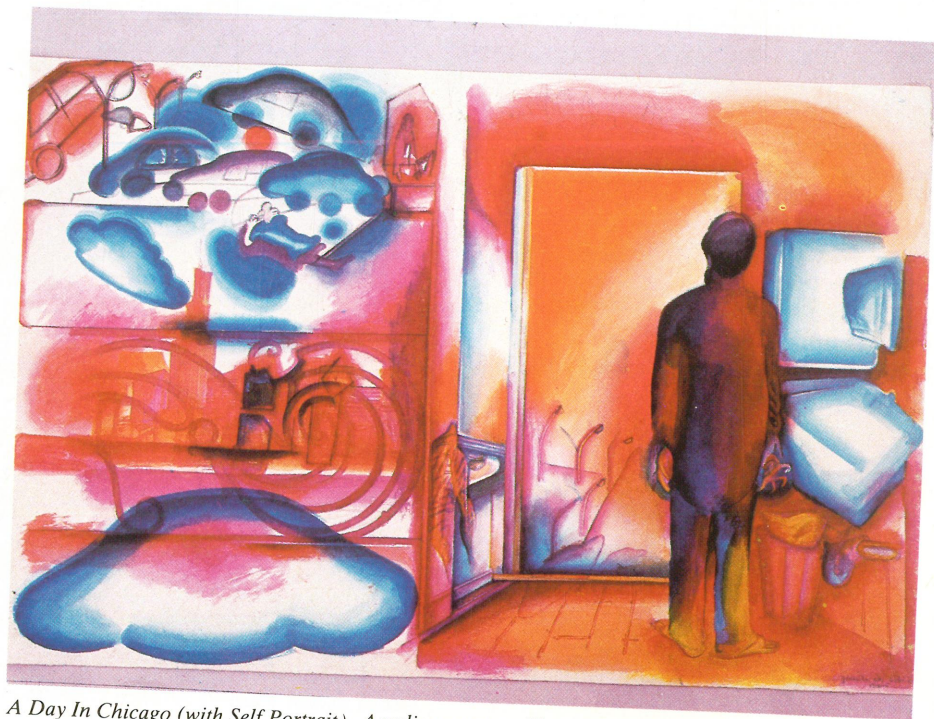

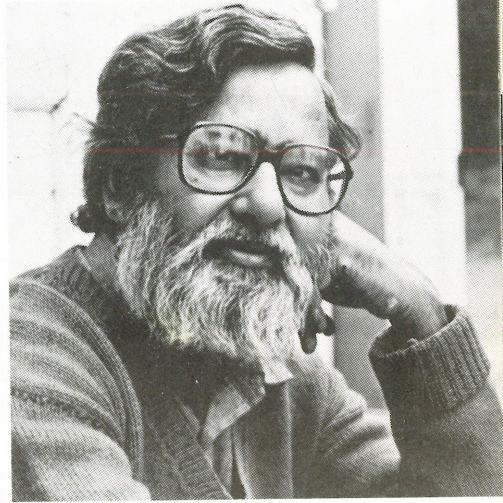
